We were deeply saddened by the unexpected loss of Town Council President James H. Crocker, Jr. in late October. We continue to keep his family in our thoughts and prayers.

Election Day is November 5, 2019. Town Clerk Ann Quirk, Assistant Town Clerk Janet Murphy and the dedicated staff of the Town Clerk's office have been hard at work

getting ready for the election that includes all thirteen precincts. Over 120 poll workers turn out each Election Day to help things run as smoothly as possible throughout the Town. This election includes the odd numbered precincts on the Town Council, three seats on the School Committee and two seats on the Housing Authority. This is the opportunity for your voice to be heard. We hope that you will exercise your right to vote.

I want to recognize the patience of our citizens and visitors as the Town of Barnstable continues with a multitude of roadway projects. I know that such projects cause inconveniences to our daily routine, but I am sure our citizens will be pleased with the results.

We hope that you will join us in honoring Veterans of all wars by taking a moment to say thank you to the men and women who have served our country so valiantly. The Annual Veterans' Day Parade will also be held on Monday, November 11th on Main Street. The parade steps off at 10:00 AM and concludes at the Village Green with a program that will feature the laying of wreaths and Keynote Speaker. This year the Veterans Town Hall is returning to Barnstable Town Hall on Monday, November 11th immediately following the parade in the Town Hall Hearing Room.

In this season of Thanksgiving it seems most appropriate to express my appreciation to all of you. Happy Holiday Season to you and yours.

Town Clerk's November Notes



It is autumn, time for pumpkin carving, apple picking, football games and elections!

The absentee ballots are in the Town Clerk's office. Time is short, if you need one please come into the office to vote. All voted absentee ballots, must be back in my office before 8:00 PM on November 5th, Election Day. The last moment you can request an absentee ballot is at 11:59 AM on November 4th. At noon on November 4th, the Town Clerk's office will be closed for the remainder of the day to prepare all

the materials necessary for delivery to the polling locations for the Town Election. The last day to register to vote was October 16th.

Important Dates to Remember:

- $\sqrt{}$ November 5th Town Election Day, all polling locations will be open from 7:00 AM to 8:00 PM

All elections are important and part of the election process is your completion of the census/voter confirmation form that goes out in January. This is a mandate by the State and Federal governments that you confirm you are still at the same

location. If you do not return the census, or did not receive one, you are made "inactive". Again, that is a requirement of the law. You can still vote, but you will be required to provide us with documentation that you are at the same address, such as a utility bill, a rent bill or a license. Then we will fill out an affirmation of continuous residence form for you to sign, at that point you can then be given a ballot so you can vote. This takes time. Therefore, when you receive your census form in early January, remember – this will avoid any delays at the polling place. If you have any doubts about your voter status please call 508-862-4044, we will be happy to verify your current status.

We have an aggressive election schedule in 2020. So please return those Census forms when you receive them in January and avoid additional time spent filling out forms. The following is our election schedule for 2020, please come out and cast your ballot:

- $\sqrt{}$ March 3rd Presidential Preference Election
- $\sqrt{}$ September (no date yet) the State Primary Election
- $\sqrt{$ **November 3**rd General Election
- $\sqrt{}$ YOUR VOTE IS YOUR VOICE! Exercise your right to vote! All elections are important and your vote does count.



SEE MERCURY TRANSIT ACROSS THE SUN!

On November 11th (Veteran's Day), the planet Mercury will be transiting (crossing) the Sun. It is the only time you are able to view Mercury during the daytime, and also experience its relative size compared to our Sun. Tiny! The next time this celestial event will occur will be in the year 2032.


All are invited to attend this celestial event. There is no cost of admission due to the generous funding provided by Steve Heslinga (Trustee of the Enoch Cobb Trust Fund). Solar telescopes, solar binoculars,

SUNSPOTTERS, and solar shades will be made available at the Cobb Astro Park to **safely** view Mercury and the Sun. Activities related to the Human Sundial and Pathway of Discovery are also planned for this event. Enter at the Knight Auditorium and take the first left at the 1700 hallway. Halfway down the 1700 hallway, on the right, you will see a sign for the Cobb Astro Park. We'll be there to welcome you to the park.

Since the total event time of the transit is 5 hours and 28 minutes, you can show up whenever it is convenient for you, your students, your family, or your friends. Better yet, invite a veteran

to view this cosmic happening. It will be a unique way to thank them for their service.

TRANSIT TIMES:7:36 AMMercury will start to move in front of the Sun;By 10:20 AMMercury will have moved to the middle of the Sun's disk;1:04 PMMercury will have moved off the Sun's disk until the next time in 2032!

November and the cooler weather has arrived! I wanted to update you on current news and exciting developments around the district:

October was MASS STEM Month: Barnstable Public Schools (BPS) students participated in SE Mass Aviation Career Fair and Mass Zero Waste Challenge BPS Achieving Excellence Spotlight: Barnstable High School's (BHS) Shawn Calle wins scholarship at WPI Invitational Math Meet

Southeastern Mass Aviation Career Fair

Over the past few years, Barnstable Municipal Airport (Hyannis Airport) has made it their goal to get more kids interested in aviation by hosting various events. This year, Hyannis Airport, in conjunction with Massachusetts Air And Space Museum, Inc. (MASM), airport tenants and other aviation professionals hosted a Workforce Development Expo: "Southeastern Massachusetts Aviation Career Fair" on October 15, 2019, held at the terminal building.

Exhibitors demonstrated how STEM can help develop workforce leaders of the future. 45 BHS Computer Science and Engineering students attended the Aviation Career Fair. BPS students were able to explore career opportunities/pathways, speak with adults in various industries, participate in flight simulations and tour facilities and equipment. Many connections were made and more opportunities will be available to our students in the near future.

BHS Students Participate in Zero Waste Challenge

Hosted by Project Lead The Way, TD Garden, MA Department of Environmental Protection, and MA STEM Hub, Engineering Design students at Barnstable High School participated in the "zero waste" realworld design challenge that included K-12 students throughout Massachusetts.

BHS' Shawn Calle Wins Scholarship at Invitational Math Meet

A big shout out goes to our Barnstable High students - members of Mu Alpha Theta - at the Worcester Polytechnic Institute (WPI) Invitational Math Meet, and Shawn Calle, whose scores earned him a scholarship for having the highest ranking on the team. Way to go Shawn and BHS!

The contest held on October 15 consisted of two rounds of competition. The first round was an individual

competition and the second round was a team effort. Both rounds consisted of interesting and challenging questions based on the secondary mathematics curriculum up to, but not including, calculus. A short program introduced the students to WPI, as well as a talk about pursuing degrees and careers in the mathematical sciences.




TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2018-085 ATTUCKS LANE PUMP STATION AREA, SEWER EXPANSION

Description : Installing sewer to feed the soon to be installed Attucks Lane Pump Station to south of Route 132 and Old Strawberry Hill Road. This project will provide the businesses and residences a municipal solution to their wastewater issues, and in doing so begin to protect Shallow Pond from nutrients. This project is addressing areas that are included in the Water Resource Advisory Committee recommended Wastewater Management Plan.


THE HARBORMASTER'S OFFICE WOULD LIKE TO REMIND ALL BOATERS
