Councilor Atsalis thanked Mr. Jope for coming back and showing interest again in the Committee. The growth in our senior population in the coming years, are there one or more things we need to do to get ready for that population to be pro-active in reaching and servicing those needs.

He has put some great programs together and had put together little sub committees within the Council on Aging who would be working on different ideas, the Agenda was always timely and posted correctly, It is just a breath of fresh air your deciding to return.

Councilor Starr agrees with everyone, and thanked Mr. Jope for returning.

Councilor Schnepp is also glad that he had decided to return, and thanked him for his years prior, and also for coming in tonight to reapply for his position.

Ms. Hinckley-Needham has lived on the Cape her whole life; currently works at Cape Cod Health Care and Falmouth Hospital. When she works in the Emergency Room for Cape Cod Healthcare, she sees a lot of mental health issues, drug problems, homeless individuals, alcoholism; there are huge issues on the Cape, lots of food insecurities, and she doesn't know where it all went array, she used to walk up and down Main Street all the time, and now tells her children not to, the Cape is not what it used to be, her son was killed by a drunk driver in Marstons Mills while riding his bike, so we have a huge problem here, and she would like to be part of the solution in some way, does not see any improvement, only getting worse. She loves helping people, so maybe by being on this Committee she may have a chance to actually bring some change and relief to people that are struggling every day.

Councilor Atsalis appreciates her commitment to wanting to join another Committee for our Town, and believes Ms. Needham will be an asset to this Committee.

Councilor Shaughnessy thanked Ms. Hinckley-Needham for coming in and mentioned she also shares the same grief of losing someone dear to her by a drunk driver, and she understands the passion. Councilor Shaughnessy believes that Ms. Hinckley-Needham will be a very valuable asset to this Committee.

Frances Parks consideration of reappointment to the Historical Commission

Ms. Parks currently is a member of the Trust Fund Advisory, Historical Commission, and the Local Comprehensive Planning Board, and will admit that on the Historical Commission meetings will become rattled when other members whisper under their breath or try to undermine her as a Chair; but believes that has all been worked out. If there were issues on the Historical Commission when she became Chair that was brought to Councilor Atsalis's attention, they were not told to her, or the Director of Planning and Development, Elizabeth Jenkins. Ms. Parks would very much like to stay on the Historical Commission but does not believe that Councilor Atsalis will not make the same comments at the Town Council level, and she does not want them to be part of a record in the Town. Ms. Parks has chosen not to be reappointed to the Historical Commission.

Chair of the Committee thanked Ms. Parks for her time on the Historical Commission, and appreciates her service to the Committee. Councilor Shaughnessy wanted to thank Ms. Parks for her time on the Historical Commission and is sad that Cotuit will not be represented, but is thankful that Ms. Parks will remain on the Local Comprehensive Planning, as well as the Trust Fund Advisory Committee, and hopes that Ms. Parks knows how grateful we are for her years of dedication of service to the town and all the issues that come up, with her thoughtful comments.
