 - b. Currently 30 lifeguards short
- 2. Operational and program protocols are being updated as new guidance becomes available
- 3. Heroes parade was held for Isaac Reyes

B. Aquatics

- 1. Parking Permits
 - a. Available by mail or online
 - b. Will not be issued in person
 - c. Over 8,500 resident/taxpayer permits have been sold to date
 - d. Turn-around time is between 2-3 weeks
- 2. Lifeguard Tryouts
 - a. Both in-person and remotely
 - b. Short around 30 lifeguards to date
 - c. Very concerned about the lifeguard shortage
 - d. Discussion followed

C. HYCC

- 1. Barnstable Recreation continues to collaborate with Cape Cod Culinary Incubators to provide meals at the HYCC on Friday evenings from 4-6PM
- 2. Learn to Skate's spring session just finished up
- 3. Adult Hockey programs are running along with some rentals for figure skating

 - a. Once completed, Public Skate and Walk-on Figure Skating sessions will be started
- 5. Mark Boardley has implemented gym times for volleyball and basketball
 - b. Middle School and High School students
 - c. Everyone must register to participate
 - d. DPW put in new volleyball stanchions in the gym

 - b. Both of them will be shown in High School science classes
 - c. They will be available on the Town of Barnstable website once completed
- 4. Youth Commissioner Nina Barrette was asked to introduce the Town Manager at the Silent Springs STEEP Webinar Series on PFAA

 - b. The reason for her being asked to make the introduction was because the Town Manager wants to emphasize the need for the youth to be engaged in all these discussions
