SHELLFISH COMMITTEE MINUTES OF THE MEETING DATE: January 11, 2023 TIME: 6:00-8:00 PM

Al Surprenant called the meeting to order at 6:05 PM, as January 11, 2023 meeting of the Shellfish Committee. Al Surprenant read a notice at the beginning of the meeting:

TOPICS FOR DISCUSSION

- **1. Approve Meeting Minutes:** Kris Clark needs to be removed as Town Council Liaison. Patricia Farinha moved to approve the December 14, 2022 meeting minutes and Jake Angelo seconded. There was a unanimous vote in favor of approving minutes with the name correction.

- 3. Natural Resources Report / Correspondence:
 - 1. Shellfish Growing Area Updates

Marstons Mills River and Prince Cove will open as of February 15, pending water quality. No shellfish permit numbers will be presented until March. Because of the change in expiration date on the permits from March to January, there were not any renewals at this time last year.

Commercial lottery applications are due by January 31st and the hearing for the commercial lottery will take place February 1st at 10 am. A tally of the amount of oysters harvested this year vs last year will be presented at the April or May meeting, after oyster season is over.

4. New Business:

1. Corporate Leasing of Aquaculture Licenses- originally brought to Committee by Al Surprenant

Presented by Dave Ryan of Cape Cod Oyster Company, of which started in the mid 1990's. This was introduced at the last meeting. Mr. Ryan stated he thinks it's in the best interest of the industry and the town that the family businesses continue. He would like to license the business in a way that reflects the way the farms are run instead of have multiple individual licenses. The reporting for the town will be more accurate having one accurate report instead of seven smaller broken up reports. Discussion followed where other families with family businesses agreed that this would make things easier. Concerns were voiced, including losing quality and volume of oyster from what a lot of older folk have built up to, as well as what will happen if multiple farms were consolidated under one name. A suggestion was made to table the proposal and come back to it, having been given a lot of information to think about and ask questions about.

5. Upcoming (and Old) Renewal & Transfer Hearings:

1. Hearing for the renewal of aquaculture licensed siteng038 in Barnstable Harbor for Carl Carlson, 275 Old Jail Lane, Barnstable, MA 02630 for a period of 10 years. Public hearing to be held via Zoom, 01/17/2023 at 9:00AM via Zoom

As Carl Carlson was not present, Constable Croteau presented this renewal. He has approximately .82 acres. Nothing is changing and he is looking for a 10 year renewal, this being his first renewal. Al made a motion to recommend renewal for Carl Carlson and Tyler seconded; unanimous vote in favor.

6. Upcoming (and old) Proposed Coastal Projects:

- 1. Constable Croteau gave an update of 150 Carriage Rd, which went before the Conservation Commission on the 3rd. It will be continued to Valentine's Day with the Conservation Commission feeling it is an extremely overbuilt dock for kayaks. They are being asked to come back with different plans.
