SUBJECT: Aviation Way Taking and Mary Dunn Way Discontinuance

BACKGROUND: Mary Dunn Road is a road that predates the existence of the airport. It even predates the existence of the portion of Route 28 between the Yarmouth town line and the Airport Rotary. In 1927, when Route 28 was being laid out, the Town created a new layout for the portion of Mary Dunn Road, now known as Mary Dunn Way located between the east side of the air field and Route 28. That location violates present day FAA standards for safety areas at the ends of runways.

In order to improve safety and better comply with FAA regulations, the Airport has created a new road, named Aviation Way, from Route 28 to the Airport's East Ramp area that is located farther away from the end of the runway.

ANALYSIS: The Town should discontinue the layout of both Mary Dunn Way and the portion of Old Mary Dunn road that lie on the runway side of Airport Way. This will mean that those areas will cease to be roads and will become part of the Airport. The newly created road known, as Aviation Way should be accepted as a Town road since it serves the same function as the public road that it replaced. It is a newly constructed road built to present day standards and will require less maintenance than the road that it replaced.

By discontinuing the roads within the safety zone, the Town reduces its potential liability of having public roads within a sensitive airport safety area and provides improved protection for the people using the town's airport.

FISCAL IMPACT: There should be no measurable fiscal impact to the Town.

SUBJECT: FY 2008 Other Requirements Budget

BACKGROUND: The Town of Barnstable is part of a regional veterans' district. Every year it is assessed a portion of district's budget which includes the director, staff and operating expenses of running the district. In addition, the Town is responsible for a portion of the direct bills for eligible veterans living in Barnstable for items such as doctor and hospital bills, medications and medical equipment, heating fuel assistance and other costs.

ANALYSIS: Since the Town is the last payer, a vendor must bill the insurance companies, Medicare, Mass Health or the VA before the Town has to pay. This often causes a delay in vendor billing while they wait for payment or the denial of the coverage. Any unpaid balance is then billed the Veterans' District for processing. Due to the increased numbers of Veterans out of work or have lost their health care, and due to the rising costs of health care, additional funds are needed to pay the FY08 benefits.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Town of Barnstable budgeted \$172,705 for FY08 veterans' benefits. To date, only \$1,927 remains unexpended in this account with 31/2 months remaining in the fiscal year. A request for an additional \$70,000 is being made to cover the rest of FY08. Funding for this will be provided from the municipal savings account which has a balance of \$3,307,897. Any remaining funds left over at the end of FY08 will be credited back to the municipal savings account.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: The Town Manager recommends approval of the transfer order first mortgage and/or less equity proceeds could occur.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact. The total amount of monies is to come from the embarkation fees, which is appropriately directed to the Hyannis Waterfront area.

Inner Harbor Bulkhead Failure

BACKGROUND: On March 8, 2008, a northeasterly storm affected Cape Cod with wind gusts in excess of 60 mph and torrential rains, resulting in the structural failure of a section of the Barnstable Inner Harbor bulkhead. The failed section resulted in the weakening of adjacent sections of the over 40-year-old wooden bulkhead. In addition, a post-storm survey identified other sections of the wooden bulkhead, and adjacent parking area that exhibit signs of potential failure. Emergency stabilization of the failure area was undertaken immediately, along with steps to protect public safety. Engineering design of emergency repairs to the failure area and necessary steps to stabilize other potential failure areas commenced immediately. Construction of the necessary repairs should be completed early in the upcoming boating season. Evaluation and design of the replacement of the entire wooden bulkhead and necessary work on the steel bulkhead is underway, along with necessary work to address drainage issues.

ANALYSIS: The estimated cost of the emergency response for contracted services and overtime for municipal staff totals \$196,000. The costs were and shall incur as follows: emergency repair work completed \$25,363, estimated emergency repairs and stabilization to be completed \$170,640.

FISCAL IMPACT: This one-time expense will not be added to the Marina Enterprise Fund base operating budget. Funding will be provided from balances that remain in previous appropriations under the Marina Enterprise Fund as well as Marina Enterprise Fund Surplus. A total of \$77,840 remains unexpended from council order 2002-040 to acquire the Prince Cove Marina and \$63,969 from council order 1999-014 for replacing the Bismore and Aselton Park bulkheads. The remaining \$54,191 will be appropriated from the Marina Enterprise Fund Surplus, which has a balance of \$111,141.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: The Town Manager recommends approval of the appropriation order after the required public hearing. The Town Manager recommends the approval of the transfer of these funds.

SUBJECT: Acceptance of a gift from the Cape Cod Oyster Company

BACKGROUND: The Town of Barnstable Natural Resources Program has been propagating oysters in Barnstable Harbor for the benefit of recreational shell fishermen and resource enhancement. The gift of oysters would benefit the efforts to enhance the oyster populations of the Three Bays on the Town's Southside. Adverse environmental and biological factors (i.e., severe ice conditions, predators, and diseases) have affected and the standing populations have significantly dwindled. The Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries (DMF) has approved of the Town's request to receive and propagate the gift of oysters in the Three Bays.

ANALYSIS: The Cape Cod Oyster Company has devised a protocol to grade and size the gift oysters at their aquaculture facilities in North Bay with assistance from Natural Resources staff. Natural Resources is permitted by the DMF to plant the oyster seed at numerous sites in the Three Bays, will perform all propagation and planting operations.

FISCAL IMPACT: The Marine and Environmental Affairs Division Natural Resources Program will assign staff labor to fulfill the procedures of evaluating, propagating and planting the oysters.
