Old Business:

1. Discussion took place regarding developing an in-season boat storage plan on Town Property. This plan would define what vessels are allowed at Town Landings and Ways to Water. This topic will be discussed monthly and recommendations will be presented to the Town Manager once completed. Chairman Meade stated he has received the Town of Bourne's Policy for review. Other ideas that were mentioned are as follows: issuance of a dinghy sticker with mooring permit, determination of what size vessels will be allowed at Town Ways to Water, and potential construction of dinghy docks or rack system at the busier landings. Mr. Hazelton mentioned he would want to make sure that people without moorings still have access to Ways to Water. Further discussion will take place during next meeting.

New Business:

1. Mooring Officer Lawson believes the Lake Wequaquet Yacht Club mooring area is at capacity and would like to establish an open waiting list for the area. Currently the area has 70 moorings. A mooring area will be defined and the Mooring Officer will work with the mooring servicers to create a fairway. No objections were made by the Water Ways committee.

Harbor Master Report:

1. Mooring Officer Lawson stated that staff is actively using GIS technology and mapping all mooring areas.
