

# JULY GEMS FROM THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE

All dogs need their new tags on their collars as of July 1. If you have not purchased a new dog license – come on down to the Town Clerk's office, or send your request and check by mail. Remember, beginning August 1, 2019, a new license will cost you more money due to a late fee of \$5.00 on top of the cost of your license. So save your money and take care of this now!

Our office is gearing up for the fall election. This fall we will have our Town Election. If you have ever considered running for the Town Council or School Committee or Housing Authority come to see us at the Town Clerks office. The nomination papers were available on June 20<sup>th</sup>.

- 1. Wednesday, **October 16th** is the last day to register to vote for the November Election.
- 2. Tuesday, **November 5<sup>th</sup>**, is our Town Election with voting hours from 7 AM to 8 PM. Please mark your calendars to come out and vote for Town Councilors, School Committee, and Housing Authority!

### Remember your vote is your voice!

If you are a registered voter, hopefully you filled out your census this year because that form is a voter confirmation certificate as well. By responding to the census, you are providing proof of your residency to protect your voting rights. To avoid any delays at the polls this fall, please call our office to verify your voter status. If you are inactivated, you may have to show current ID and fill out a form to prove you still live at that address. If you want to confirm your residency/voter status you can stop by our office or call 508-862-4044.

If you have moved, even within the Town of Barnstable, you need to inform the Town Clerk's office so we can update your voter information. Remember every vote does count, and we want to count your vote!!!

FY19 Capital Budget Summary - General Fund, Enterprise Funds, Sewer Construction and Private Way Fund, and Community Preservation Fund



# TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2018-079 EFFLUENT DISCHARGE LOCATION EVALUATIONS

# **Description**

Currently the WPCF discharges treated effluent into sand filter beds which percolates back into the groundwater. The facility has a permitted treatment capacity of 4.2 million gallons per day (MGD), but recent modeling efforts have suggested that the WPCF may not be able to discharge 4.2 MGD without impacting septic systems and basements located at downgradient properties. Though the WPCF is going to be conducting an independent study to evaluate the validity of this claim, it also needs to prepare in case those suggestions are proven to be correct. This project will begin that process by identifying and conducting some initial evaluation of the best disposal options/sites.

# **SMALL VESSEL STORAGE** PERMITS ARE NOW REQUIRED

New this year is a requirement for those who store a dinghy or small vessel on Town land to purchase (and place on the vessel) a decal issued by the Harbormaster Division. The decal is for identification purposes and will allow us to not only better track what's being placed on Town land and by whom, but for safety purposes as well should the vessel go adrift. Vessels placed on Town Ways to water must be no greater than 12' in length overall with a beam no greater than 5'.

The decal will be available Monday through Friday 8:30 AM - 4:15 PM at the Marine and Environmental Affairs Department located at 1189 Phinney's Lane. Centerville, MA 02632.

# **A REMINDER** FROM ANIMAL CONTROL

Pursuant to the Town Manager's Dog Control Regulations,

"no person owning or having the care, custody or control of any dog shall allow said dog on any Town Beach or Recreation area from May 15 to September 15 without the written authorization of the Town Manager or official in control of said Beach or Recreation area." Please Note: Dogs are not allowed in your car in the parking lot.




