COMMUNITY SERVICE OFFICERS returning to Main St, Hyannis for 4th season

Commencing June 3rd, ten Community Service Officers (CSO) will report for 40 hrs of training at

the Barnstable Police Department. Seven young men and three young women will spend the week participating in physical training, as well as receiving instruction in topics such as CPR, First Aid, Narcan®, Community Policing, Mental Health First Aid, and Defensive Tactics.

The CSOs will again be working in conjunction with the Community Impact Unit, acting as liaisons between sworn police personnel and the Main Street businesses, tourists, and residents.

You can renew your dog's license by mail by sending to us the following:

- a stamped self-address envelope;
- Include a check made out to the Town of Barnstable for \$7.00 for a spayed or neutered animal, or \$10.00 for a male or female dog;
- a copy of the current rabies certificate (if it has been updated recently); and
- Please include your email address as this will enable us to send out a reminder for next year's dog licensing.
- Mail all of the above to: Town Clerk, 367 Main St., Hyannis, MA 02601.

You may also renew the dog license in person during regular office hours (Monday through Friday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM). As a reminder, you must have a new tag on your dog by July. Avoid paying a late fee and renew your dog's license now!

If you are interested in running for the Town Council, the School Committee, or the Housing Authority nomination papers will be available starting on June 19th at 6 PM in the Selectmen's Conference Room at Town Hall, 367 Main Street, Hyannis. We will cover the campaign finance laws, the number of signatures needed, and the date you need to return your nomination papers to this office. If you are unable to attend this meeting the nomination papers will be available starting on June 20th in the Town Clerk's office.

Superintendent's Corner

As we close the 2018-2019 school year, I want to share new developments at Barnstable High School for next school year. This past school year we have spent time studying how to best support educators and students at the high school. While we continue to plan and implement innovative programs and approaches to teaching and learning, we also wanted to study whether the leadership structure makes the best use of resources to support our students and educators.

Currently, Barnstable High School (BHS) is organized into five "houses" led by a "housemaster." Students are assigned to a particular house when they begin grade 8. BHS students stay with their house through the five years of high school. Each house also provides relationships with school counselors and other support services. Our study group spent time during the 2018-2019 school year to determine if this organizational structure needed to be modified in order to more fully support teachers and students. We surveyed BHS faculty and staff, visited other high schools, and reviewed the literature to learn about other models.

Our study group also identified the various roles and responsibilities that are necessary within high school leadership. We referenced the staff survey responses, particularly the need to have consistent responses to student conduct, as well as clarification on roles and responsibilities among administrators. This led us to identifying three major categories: (1) curriculum, instruction, and assessment, (2) student support, and (3) operations and management.

As a result of our discussions, a leadership structure was identified that reallocated the six positions of one assistant principal and five housemasters. Additionally, one of our parameters was to make recommendation as budget neutral as possible. Therefore, the model reallocates the six positions in the following manner:

Assistant Principal for Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment Associate Principal for Student Support Associate Principal for Operations and Management Dean of Students (3 FTEs)

The three positions of assistant and associate principals will work side by side to fully integrate each of their three areas. The three positions of Dean of Students will work with the Associate Principal of Student Support. The design of the Dean of Students positions with an Associate Principal of Student Support is intended to support all students in meeting academic, social, emotional and behavioral expectations.

Parents and students should expect to hear from Principal Clark in coming weeks as he shares details about how students will be supported and assigned under the new model. We are excited that we have a new and innovative structure to support teaching and learning at Barnstable High School.

TOWN COUNCIL ORDER: 2018-078 EFFLUENT DISPOSAL CAPACITY STUDY & DESIGN

Description

The purpose of this project is to hire a consultant to lead an Effluent Disposal Capacity Study & Design for the Hyannis Water Pollution Control Facility (WPCF). Currently the WPCF discharges treated effluent into sand filter beds, which allow the treated water to percolate back into the groundwater. This project builds off previous groundwater modeling efforts in order to determine the exact amount of treated water that can be disposed of at the Hyannis WPCF. While previous modeling efforts have provided the Town with a ballpark estimate of the discharge capacity of the WPCF, this project aims to formulate a more precise capacity limit, which accounts for seasonal fluctuations of flow and groundwater levels. This model will take into account geologic conditions in the area of the WPCF.



- Natural Resources staff and town shellfish volunteers will be available to assist any vound digger who wants the help.
- Be prepared to get wet! Shellfish live in wet sand that gets covered by saltwater when the tide is high. Waders, hip boots or knee boots are helpful. Protective gloves are necessary.
- Shellfish may be taken by hand or rake. Small (garden) hand rakes and trowels will be allowed for the young diggers.
- Receive a free "Clammer Kid" badge, activity booklet and Certificate of Completion.
- Legally harvested shellfish may be taken home.
- SHELLFISH REGULATIONS APPLY AS ALWAYS!

The comfort and safety of participating youngsters is the responsibility of the accompanying adult.

SMALL VESSEL STORAGE PERMITS ARE NOW REQUIRED

New this year is a requirement for those who store a dinghy or small vessel on Town land to purchase (and place on the vessel) a decal issued by the Harbormaster Division. The decal is for identification purposes and will allow us to not only better track what's being placed on Town land and by whom, but for safety purposes as well should the vessel go adrift. Vessels placed on Town Ways to water must be no greater than 12' in length overall with a beam no greater than 5'.

The decal will be available Monday through Friday 8:30 AM - 4:15 PM at the Marine and Environmental Affairs Department located at 1189 Phinney's Lane, Centerville, MA 02632. Call 508-790-6273 for more information.

> A life jacket (or Personal Flotation Device - PFD) is the single most important piece of equipment on your boat and the most important consideration should be size. More than two-thirds of all boating fatalities

are drowning incidents and 90% of drowning victims were not wearing a life jacket.



News from the Sealer of Weights & Measures-Jane Zulkiewicz

Recently Barnstable Weights & Measures has received complaints about the disagreement of prices of street signs verses the price at the pump at some gas stations. Yes, the price is going up with the summer months upon us; but for now you can ensure you are getting the correct price per gallon by checking a few obvious details.

- If there is a street sign, check that the price on the gas pump for that octane advertised matches on the pump and the LED.
- Make sure that the sale and the gallons display start at zero before you begin to pump.
- For additional accuracy, calculate the gallons pumped times the price per gallon for total money
- Always get a receipt and take a picture if you have a discrepancy and contact Barnstable Weights & Measures.

Barnstable Weights & Measures employees conduct all their inspections with uniformity at all locations in the ten towns we serve. If you have any questions or concerns regarding the performance of a commercial weighing or measuring device used for trade, bring it to the attention of the merchant. If the problem is not resolved, contact the local Weights & Measures office for advice and/or assistance. The Barnstable Weights & Measures jurisdiction includes: Barnstable, Bourne, Brewster, Chatham, Dennis, Harwich, Mashpee, Orleans, Sandwich and Yarmouth.


