FROM THE TOWN MANAGER



Dear Reader:

Preparations are underway for the upcoming summer season. Our DPW crews along with all departments are working to clean up all that Mother Nature has left behind. We are looking forward to the continuing seasonal changes.

As I mentioned last month, we are in budget season. Our Capital Improvements Plan (CIP) budget was presented to the Town Council in April. I will present the FY2020 Operating Budget document to the Town Council on Monday, May 6, 2019. The first

reading of the Budget will be on May 16th and the Town Council will conduct the first public hearings on Thursday, June 6, 2019.

The Town of Barnstable has been hard at work with regards to Water Quality issues in town. Barnstable's Channel 18 has prepared a YouTube playlist of pieces they have done on Water Quality Resource Efforts in the Town of Barnstable. You can find it here: http://tiny.cc/prgc5y. The pieces include information about Water Quality Planning, Herring Run 2019, Cotuit Bay Dredging, Barnstable at Work – Hyannis Water Supply Division, Water Quality Testing in the Three Bays and more. This playlist will be updated on a regular basis as the information becomes available.

At the January 3, 2019 Town Council meeting, DPW Director Dan Santos presented an Update on Wastewater Management Efforts in Barnstable. Mr. Santos was joined by Assistant DPW Director Rob Steen, Interim Town Engineer Amanda Ruggiero, and Interim Assistant Town Engineer Griffin Beaudoin who have been working on the planning internally. Mr. Santos' presentation can be viewed here: http://tiny.cc/0ygc5y. Additional updates have been provided at the February 28, 2019 Town Council Meeting and March 21, 2019 Town Council Meeting.

Memorial Day is Monday, May 27th. Veterans Services is working on the Annual Memorial Day Parade in the Village of Centerville. The John F. Kennedy Memorial will host our annual event on Memorial Day at 12:15 PM. Memorial Day is an opportunity for us to remember those who made the ultimate sacrifice.

Hello Barnstable!

We are selling the 2019 dog tags for your canine starting the first week of May. In the next edition of the Barnstable Bulletin, we will feature Barnstable's Best Dog!

You can renew your dog's license by mail by sending the following:

- a stamped self-address envelope;
- Include a check made out to the Town of Barnstable for \$7.00 for a spayed or neutered animal, or \$10.00 for a male or female dog;
- a copy of the current rabies certificate (if it has been updated recently);
- Please include your email address this will enable us to send out a reminder for next year's dog licensing.
- Mail all of the above to: Town Clerk, 367 Main Street, Hyannis, MA 02601.

Starting on May 6th, you may also renew the dog license in person during regular office hours (Monday through Friday 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM). A photo of Barnstable's Best Dog will be in our June notes since we have not had the voting yet. A big thank you to all the dog owners who entered their favorite canine in the contest. It is so much fun to see all the great photos of the dogs. All the visitors to our office enjoy looking at the photos and voting for their favorite dog!

Remember you must have a new tag on your dog by July. To avoid having to pay late fees renew your license now! Remember our dog year runs from July 1st to June 30th, so these new tags should go on your dog's collar on July 1st.

If you are interested in running for the Town Council, the School Committee, or the Housing Authority, nomination papers will be available starting on June 19th at 6 PM in the Selectmen's Conference Room at Town Hall, 367 Main Street, Hyannis. We will cover the campaign finance laws, the number of signatures needed, and the date you need to return your nomination papers to this office. If you are unable to attend this meeting the nomination papers will be available starting on June 20th in the Town Clerk's office.

A NOTE FROM THE TOWN COLLECTOR:

FRIENDLY REMINDER: Fourth Quarter Real Estate and Personal Property Tax bills are due May 1, 2019.

The first commitment of Motor Vehicle Excise Tax bills was issued on February 20, 2019 and was due on March 22, 2019 and the second commitment has also been issued on April 15, 2019 and due on May 15, 2019. There are several commitments issued each year for the current year and also for prior years. These bills should be paid timely to avoid interest and penalties. If a bill is issued, it does not go away. You must pay the excise or file for an abatement with the Assessor's office if you no longer own the vehicle and should be done by the due date to avoid interest and penalties.

Superíntendent's Corner



I am pleased to share that Barnstable Public Schools is undertaking an effort to improve the effectiveness and equity of services for supporting struggling students both with and without special needs.

While we are proud of the quality of services provided to students with disabilities and the hard work of our staff who help all children achieve at high levels, ever-higher expectations require us to look for ways to further increase student learning and improve the way we deliver services to our students. The district has engaged the District Management Group, a Boston-based organization to assist with this project.

This systematic study will examine our current regular and special education services, programs, procedures, and staffing for serving struggling students through the use of quantitative (both indistrict and benchmark district information) and qualitative data gathering (using focus groups, stakeholder interviews, and classroom observations). The review will also help the district understand how various categories of staff use their time as they serve struggling students. With this information, the district will be able to make thoughtful and informed decisions to ensure all of our students receive appropriate support.

The result should be a better picture of what is working well in the district, a better understanding of what the appropriate level of staff and services are, overall improved delivery of services to special education students and parents, and better utilization of district resources.

We are excited to be undertaking this study and appreciate your support in this process. I will be sure to keep you updated as the project achieves key milestones. In the meantime, please let me know if you have any questions.



Description

The Hyannis Youth and Community Center was Completed in 2008. The existing membrane roof system and asphalt shingle roof have developed leaks. This project has been divided into multiple phases of work, each addressing specific elements of repair as identified by consultants. Some of the repairs may yet to be discovered. Design for all phases of work will be developed year one.



All Town-owned marinas will be open and staffed the first week of May. Seasonal Parking Passes for The Marina at Prince Cove are now available at the Harbormaster's office at:

1189 Phinney's Lane, Centerville, MA 02632, www.townofbarnstable.us/HarborMaster (508) 790-6273

New this year is a requirement for those who store a dinghy or small vessel on Town land to **NEW** Purchase (and place on the vessel) a decal issued by the Harbormaster Division. The decal is for identification purposes and will allow us to not only better track what's being placed on Town land and by whom, but for safety purposes as well should the vessel go adrift. Vessels placed on Town Ways to water must be no greater than 12' in length overall with a beam no greater than 5'.

The decal will be available Monday through Friday 8:30 AM - 4:15 PM at the Marine and Environmental Affairs Department located at 1189 Phinney's Lane, Centerville, MA 02632. Call 508-790-6273 for more information.


